It would be wonderful to say that food insecurity in our area has been eliminated. Unfortunately, the numbers say that it continues and in fact, has grown. The Waterville Area Soup Kitchen has served more meals in the first 9 months of 2024 than in all of 2023.

Average Daily Meals Served

- 2022 165
- 2023 205
- 2024 so far 296



With sources of low-cost and no-cost food supplies, the average cost of the 7,403 meals produced in August, with all operating costs included, was \$1.80




Special thanks to a local individual for the generous gift of a washer/dryer. What a treat to no longer haul laundry home each evening!
